COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

ART OF DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY I (02):

This is a hands-on introduction to Digital Photography. Students explore basic elements of composition and principles of design including light, movement and color theory. Combining training in camera operation and image editing with artistic theory, students learn to creatively communicate their ideas through the art of photography.

ART OF DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY II (03):

Students use advanced software and photo skills for graphic and image manipulation to create commercial graphic products and aesthetic fine-art images. The goal of this course is to develop advanced digital artists and photographers by teaching a variety of skills and outcomes.
