AP Studio Art is a course designed for the visual arts student who is interested in creating a portfolio of work to demonstrate inquiry through art and design and development of materials, processes and ideas in the course of a year. Students show advanced proficiency through the submission of the AP 2-D Art and Design or AP Drawing portfolios to the college board. They will develop a body of related works based upon their interests that demonstrate a plan of action and sustained investigation. Portfolios may be completed either digitally or using traditional materials according to student preference.



OHS participated in the 2016 Vans Custom Culture Contest. The OHS team finished 1st in California and 2nd in the nation earning the Art department \$4,000.

Advanced Art is a year-long course in which students explore drawing and painting as a creative and expressive endeavor. They create original works of art that reflect in-depth knowledge in the use of materials and artistic techniques, as well as being introduced to new media. Students apply knowledge gained in Art I to their own works and the works of others, and study the historical and cultural aspects of art through research and analysis.

*Students may join Advanced Art in 9th grade with teacher recommendation or portfolio review

CERAMICS

Ceramics I is a year-long lecture and lab course in which students explore clay as a creative material. Students apply their knowledge of the elements of art and the principles of design to their own works of art and the works of others. Students also develop portfolios for evaluation, assessment, exhibition, scholarships, college entrance, and employment.

- How to create original works of art using a variety of materials and techniques
- How to develop a portfolio of art work to be used for assessment, promotion, and exhibition
